How to participate in the tour

- 1. **Follow** the map to locate specific sites important to the rich history of Somerset.
- 2. Find the tour sign once at the location. The scannable QR code will lead you to this site.
- 3. Press play on the correct audio recording below as you view the location.

This self-guided tour is **2.5 miles long**, starting and ending at the Somerset Public Library, and takes roughly 1 **hour 30 minutes** to complete when walking. You may choose to park and walk, or drive along the tour route. No matter your choice, we ask that you please follow general road safety rules and regulations.




Village Park
