Project Overview

The UWSP Libraries received a WiLS Ideas to Action Grant to expand *Poem in Your Pocket Day* beyond campus to the Central Wisconsin region. The project encouraged community members to connect, engage, share, and inspire each other through poetry, highlight library collections, and foster community connections post-pandemic.

Event Date: April 18, 2024

Goal: Rebuild connections across Central Wisconsin through poetry and library engagement.

Accomplishments

Community Outreach

- Contacted over 50 organizations and businesses in Central Wisconsin. Secured participation commitments from 26 organizations.

Project Coordinators

- Established the “*Pocket Protectors Committee*” to manage the project and timeline.
- Committee Members: Nerissa Nelson (Project Lead), Circulation Coordinator, two English Professors.
- Student Ambassadors: Two students created videos and interviewed students about poetry.

Campus Presence

- Created a display in the library lobby showcasing:
 - Poetry from library collections
 - Local poetry publications from *Cornerstone Press*
 - Promotion of *Poem in Your Pocket Day*

Poetry Engagement

- Held a “Nominate a Poem” contest (this was open to campus and the community):
 - Received 27 submissions, accepted 24. Included original student works for distribution

Visual Identity

- Developed a graphic for promotional materials.

Created a [LibGuide](#) with:

- Downloadable poems for sharing
- Event information and participating partners
- Acknowledgment of WiLS support
- Student Ambassador videos
- Other resources

Distribution

- Printed, rolled, and bagged approximately 4,000 poems (about 100 for each community partner, with additional sets for campus).
 - Delivered poems and event instructions to community partners during spring break.

- Distributed a short feedback survey to participants
- Positive feedback indicated strong engagement and community connection
- Results will inform potential annual repetition with WiLS partners
